**Greetings Dear FISTS** 

Welcome to the first edition of BP for 2019!

As I write this I am getting close to completing my latest project, a Tim Walford designed Radio Transceiver called the Beer and Stout. The Beer is a multi band receiveer – sold as a dual bander but upgradeable to three or four bands. I have made mine for 20,30,40 and 80 m. The Stout is a complimentary transmit section which is fitted to convert the thing to transceive mode. The radio was designed from the outset as a cw transceiver so it has no SSB function at all…hurrah!! On the front panel we have sidetone adjust, power adjust and a switchable filter (which IS marked as SSB / CW but is really just wide and narrow). It gives 5 watts out.

Now the sad bit...after Tim had designed it he sold preciely ONE unit! So I have the rarest of commercial kit rigs...serial number 001 of a run of...one. This is fully understandable as Tim says, there are better, cheaper, smaller easier kit radios out there so why would anyone buy this one? Well, for me because it is old fasjioned soldering of wire ended components which could teach me a huge amount about home building. And it has, boy oh boy has it.

I have built a fair bit of stuff and a lot of Elecraft but Tim's work isn't in the Elecraft league and I have had to do a fair bit of figuring out sometimes. As mine is essentially beta testing the kit I have had some very deep headscratching times I can tell you...your kit will benefit! If you like receiving big bags of components that build into a rather decent CW radio, this could be a nice project for you. It is not a first build, but if you've got a decent soldering technique and know a diode from a resistor, it could be a fun summer project. You wont see this kit on his website, <a href="http://www.walfords.net">http://www.walfords.net</a>, because he took it off as it just wasn't selling: but you wouldn't be dissappointed if you emailed him and bought one. I hope mine is ready to operate in the next few nights. I will perhaps add more to a KN article.

Well, enough of that. Onto the last years league...as it stands now we have:

We will have more Day Hopper this year and the SK week will reappear too, retaining it's new format as this seems to have been very well received for a variety of reasons. The idea of a two or four seasonal SKW is interesting...let me think about that one. I really don't want to overburden either Graham or the members with activities every five minutes! I haven't forgotten that we mentioned an activity for older gear – c 1970-1990 - but for now I need to let Graham's wife have Graham back.
