Welcome to another edition of BP.

As I write this, SKW (Straight Key Week) logs are arriving in my inbox, already it seems that the activity has been welcomed and enjoyed by members and non members alike.

The ladder and four seasons are going along nicely. (See my comments later in this publication) Although entrants are reporting that the going has been somewhat tough over the past month. Other comments suggest that the higher bands are waking up with surprising openings to Asia. So I'd suggest that you listen on this part of our spectrum.

I'd noticed, after reading one of the articles in the RSGB Journal, that, an amateur who was using his equipment, legitimately in a country under the CEPT agreement, had to face a harrowing court appearance, and had his equipment confiscated. Without the RSGB, The Foreign Office, and the National Radio Society of the country intervention; One wonders what would have happened to the poor individual! All because of the country in question failing to understand the concept of the "Lifetime Licence" so we're told. I beg to ask the question; If the country in question had signed up to CEPT, why did the authorities in question not confirm the explanation before putting the individual before a court? I expect that there are underlying reasons that we are not aware of; but it does raise the thought that all other so called "civilised societies" are not as civilised as they purport

to be.

As you may recall, I'm hoping to operate as 5B/M0BPT next year; so I'm hoping that the Cypriot authorities do not take this kind of draconian actions against visiting/holidaying amateurs.

Hi Rob.

This month I have submitted logs for MX5IPX as well as G3ZOD. I think the appearance of MX5IPX during two of the August Ladder sessions caused a little surprise! I plan on regular appearances but I'm not going to make announcements about it, since this would lead to some disappointment due to my poor antenna. I am uploading all MX5IPX QSOs to LoTW and eQSL, although I'm not in a position to do this retrospectively. Unlike the other two club callsigns (GX3ZQS and GX0IPX), MX5IPX does not have a Century Certificate number to give out over the air. I'll do what I can to rectify this, but sadly we seem to have lost all of the MX5IPX log books, meaning that it's a case of starting

from scratch. With a grand total of 9 points out of the requisite 100 so far, it's going to take a long time.

As usual, the evening Ladder sessions proved better for 80m. During the 28th August sessions, I used a short whip as a receive antenna on 40m to try and reduce the problems I have with electrical noise on the band. This did indeed improve the signal to noise ratio on signals by a few dB. While not a lot, it made having QSO's a little easier.

To make it straightforward to see when events such as the Ladder are coming up, I've added a short list showing current and upcoming events on the top right of the FISTS website's home page <http://www.fists.co.uk>

There is also a link to the left of the list to a dedicated page that gives more room allowing better layout, information on times and events further into the future. So, no excuses for missing FISTS activities!

Finally, I'm indebted to Thomas M0TRN for pointing out a K3 modification to me, and also getting me an SMD resistor for the modification as part of an order he was putting in. This would have otherwise (for a resistor costing a few pence) cost me around £6 to order the official Elecraft modification kit from the USA or £7 to order one from the cheapest UK component supplier that stocks the particular value!! I also asked QRP project in Germany if they stocked Elecraft modifications. While they don't, I received a very helpful reply from QRP project's Nik DL7NIK discussing the various alternatives using different wattage wired resistors. So all in all, it's great that there are such helpful people as Thomas and Nik around - the amateur radio spirit is very much alive and kicking!
