I am going to give it a one year rest and may reinstate it as a bi-annual event in the future. I have something planned for 2010 which will give the membership a renewed interest.... Hi Rob. Here's my WARC Submission (QRP: 5 watts)

No new multipliers this month, so the cumulative multipliers over the three months is 7. I had a short gap with no WARC or any other QSOs due to spending time putting my new K3 rig together, but longer term it's an investment in time! I'm staying with 5 watts for the WARC Challenge and also in general, but at least I can run a bit more occasionally if needed (i.e. the Ladder).

I've heard the occasional weak European station on 17m but no contacts this month. I know that folk have been working into the USA and Australia on 17m but I've heard not so much as a dit from outside Europe. I didn't even try 12m HI. However 30m has been very productive as always.

Many highlights, but a particularly pleasing contact was OH0GG in the Aland Islands who surprised me by responding to my CQ. In hunting his Locator, I found different ones on QRZ.COM and Hamcall. Since one of them put him in the sea, I thought it best to put the other one in my log!

Another one was with DL3SEU/QRP who runs 1 watt. I used 200 milliwatts for the complete contact, which is the lowest power one I've ever had (so far!).

Thanks to Martin IK2RMZ for being the first WARC station I've contacted four times in a month!

On that subject, I wonder what opinions people have about what is a respectable period to leave before going for "repeat" contacts without annoying folk? Obviously the four contacts per month makes it easy to judge for FISTS members in the WARC Challenge, but for others I'm not so sure. Calling CQ avoids this of course, but doesn't always get results.

Finally, thank you to all the members I've contacted during the Ladder and WARC Challenge, and an especially big thank you to yourself Rob for all your work on Brasspounder and the FISTS activities.
