Now, onto the WARC Challenge

One or two comments from myself and others this month before I announce the latest results.

Firstly from Stan, K4UK who sent this with his March log;

“Enjoyed my chat with Peter, G4LHI on 17 Meters. Had to cut it short as I was in the parking lot at the golf course and I was being told to hurry up and get my golf shoes on and my golf bag out of the van so I could be ready to tee off in 5 minutes - Hi !

Two big "thrills" this month, working two stations in Australia. First VK6AU in Bremer Bay - grid OF95 and then AX4XA in Brisbane - grid QG62 both on 30 meters running my K2 at all of 14 Watts.”

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“In reply to Tim , G00D concerning his question via Email”

"Please Stan when you have time could you explain how you work CW mobile?

I guess you are not driving the car Hi."

“Almost always I am alone in the car when I operate mobile. When my wife

drives I have to wear earphones

because she doesn't want to hear the CW. She prefers music played by

Andre' Rieu !

I have the Ten-Tec Scout mounted between the seats of my Dodge Grand Caravan.

I have a single lever paddle mounted on a plywood board which sits in the passenger's seat. I steer the car with my left hand and operate the paddle with my right hand.

The Scout is quite a simple rig to operate which I can do without having to look at it.

There is a tuning knob, a gain control, and an RIT knob. There are only three switches. One is the on-off switch. The second one you flip up to select keyer speed or flip down to select RIT. The third switch you flip up to tune and flip down to select the noise limiter.

I've added a SGC DSP speaker on the output. It has two positions and does a great job eliminating QRN.

I have a metal board which I strap around my right leg on which I have a pad of paper for logging the details of the QSO.

Of course I have to copy the code in my head and I guess I've done it for so many years that it is just like listening to someone speaking.

I use Hustler antennas. On the rear left fender I have one antenna. It has a "tri-mount" which enables me to have three resonators, generally 40, 20 & 17 Meters. On the roof I have a mag-mount on which I generally have the 30 Meter Hustler.

So I can operate four bands without having to get out and change antennas.

The Scout uses individual band modules which you plug into it. I have all modules 80, 75, 40, 30, 20, 17, 15, 12 and 10

Meters. The ones not in use I store in a little box alongside the rig. I do have the 160 Meter module for the Scout, but

I've not figured out how to build up a mobile antenna for 160 Meters, so

that module stays here in the shack.

So that in a nut-shell is my setup for running mobile. I find it great fun. And helps pass the time while I'm on my 45 minute drive to the golf course. I'm generally on each Tuesday and Thursday, since that's the days our league of "Senior" men play.

The drive to the course in the morning is generally 1215 - 1300 UTC and the return trip is generally 1730 - 1815 UTC.”

Thanks to Stan for details of his “Mobile in motion”.

Is anyone going to try and work Stan whilst he's /m?

You have all the information you require, just need the band to be in good shape!

It seems that 30m has been favourable to one or two of you this month, G4LHI worked VK3DBD, fists#3756 in QF33, and of course K4UK/m #2939 in FM07 both new multipliers.

Incidentally, another comment from Stan K4UK regarding VK3DBD,

“I've been looking for David, VK3DBD because he was the chap who gave me the QSO for my "1000 Miles per Watt" certificate back on October 17, 2001 - just nine days after I had completed construction of my K2. I was running 5 Watts and calling CQ on 20 Meters when David answered me. A very BIG thrill - Hi !”

Also from Martin, IK2RMZ #853 who is joining the challenge this month.

Martin has been busy building and testing aerials for the bands.

Martin tells me that his testing phase is over and is making a “Determined assault”

On the bands during April.

So listen out for IK2RMZ in JN45.

Martin tells me that 17m opened in a “Spectacular manner” during his testing phase

With usually weak USA stations being worked on strong signal.

Ray G3ASG #2272 was omitted from last months results table, that’s down to me I’m afraid, apologies to all concerned.

Ray joined the challenge in the latter part of February and put in a good score for the month but during March made a marvelous effort and has made an excellent return for the month.

David, G0XAH #2222 has also joined the challenge this month.

Thanks to David for what must have been a busy month for him, joining us for the Ladder and WARC challenge.

Welcome to you all, and I know the guys will listen out for your calls and grids.
