# FREQUENCIES FISTS <u>CoA</u>.

New members of less than 1 year in FISTS to call CQ LFL Established members, 1 year or more, to avoid calling CQ for 5 minutes on the cardinal times (00,15,30,45). Established QSOs are not expected to cease and if you forget the activity and call CQ, never mind. Members can submit reports of numbers worked, soap-box comments etc. etc.

Logs to include callsigns, start and stop times, FISTS Nrs.

For each QSO, please type one of the following single words in your log book's COMMENT or

NOTES or equivalent field:

**GENERAL** 

**LFLNEW LFLOLD** 

The first one (LFLNEW) means that you are a new member.

The second one (LFLOLD) means that you are an established member.

Points awarded 1 per QSO to beginners and 1 per QSO exceeding 10 minutes to older hands. Points for FISTS:FISTS only.

Well folks,

Doesn't the ladder look lean??? Can ladders lean? Shouldn't they be leaning a bit? Have I drunk too much wine having escaped Dry January? Interesting that the Ladder accrued rather more logs than did the much loved SKW...can I infer anything from this? I don't think so, I think that SKW-ers simply don't send in logs...but tell me if I am wrong.

Well, I wonder how your February is kicking off? As you will see below I have added a new activity for March called the Listen for Learners challenge. The aim of this is for newcomers to CW to be able to call and get a QSO. Now, I had never considered this an issue but I guess after nearly 40 years of CW we forget how daunting it can be! I was asked by a few members to think about a L4L activity and I think this is the one! On the cardinal times, so 00, 15, 30 and 45 minutes past the hour, all old hands of over a year's CW-ing STOP calling and LISTEN for newbies. Newbies should call CQLFL or CQL4L if they wish (I know what I'd call!) and hopefully a deluge of old 'uns will respond. Do try to keep the newcomer QSO-ing for ten minutes or more so that they get into the swing of it...one point per QSO over ten minutes. After about 15 minutes you might find the newbie tiring, so prepare for sloppy cw! Another good trick is to ask the newcomer a question: for one thing it proves he is reading the code but the best thing is that he will feel like he's had a real conversation! It could be his age, how long in FISTS or even what he thinks of LFL...anything to make him have a real chat! (I say 'him', it could easily be a YL).

This activity is brand new so reports to me please about how you enjoyed it or how you think it might be improved. It isn't a contest at all and incremental points will be awarded simply by addition so that participants can see how they fared.

Later in the year I shall be unveiling (un-Vail-ing?) a rather exciting activity based around collecting letters to spell famous names. Watch this space!

Has anyone had much success mobile yet this year? I was out again today for an hour with my Icom 706 into a rather interesting Codan antenna. These are the auto tuning antennas used by UN Landrovers etc – see my QRZ page for info. They are fast and effective but mightily pricey! Mine is a borrowed unit and the owner and I are simply playing around with it. It works well and has allowed me to have my first ever (and probably last ) truly mobile CW QSO. I was driving around Salisbury Plain away from traffic and chatting on my 8 Amp style key with my left hand. Yes folks, I really was using my left hand! I was pleased with the result to be honest...it's a personal goal achieved.
