Let's look at some of the comments received and band reports during November.

Firstly from Gra. G3ZOD.

Hi Rob. Ladder 14 Nov: Well, who'd have thought it? 40m is definitely improving & I'm getting better reports than I do on 80m. I was very pleased to meet up with Peter G0TCF, #1340 for the first time.

Ladder 28th Nov: I managed a contact with Erkki OH7QR on 20m despite the CQWW contest - modern narrow filters and DSP are wonderful! It's easy to forget just how far Erkki is from the UK too - over 2000km from me - he puts out a remarkably good signal on 20m. 40m was a different story; there appeared to be gaps between the contest stations but no replies to my CQs - did everyone just assume there would be no chance of contacts on 40m or was the band actually choc-a-bloc with weaker contest stations I couldn't hear? 80m was okay but a fair amount of QSB. I was delighted to meet up with Roy GI4CBG #161 for the first time.

The VHF CW activities have been a bit varied; in the 2nd 50MHz Contest 2010 I managed to come bottom at 18/18 (saves anyone else the embarrassment, HI HI).

The 6m UKAC in October was better though with 57/67 for myself and "FISTS CW Club" stayed at the same position as last month: 31/45. I did have a go in the November 4m UKAC too, but this was a bit of a disaster with no QSOs at all, not even a cross-mode QSO with an SSB station. Ah well.
